Urlicht AudioVisual Announces New Album Haas: Violin Concerto No. 2 · de terrae fine with Miranda Cuckson, violin



The world premiere recording of a major work of one of the world's most celebrated living composers, **Georg Friedrich Haas** will be released worldwide digitally and in CD format on November 21, 2025 on Urlicht AudioVisual.

Violin Concerto No. 2 was written in 2017 for **Miranda Cuckson**, with whom the composer has long collaborated, and premiered that year with the Tokyo Symphony Orchestra conducted by Ilan Volkov.

The present recording features Miranda's live performance of *Violin Concerto No. 2* at Vienna's legendary Musikverein with the **ORF Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra** conducted by **Markus Poschner**, recorded in concert on November 24, 2023. It is coupled with her recording of *de terrae fine* for violin solo



Miranda has written, "Georg is one of the great musicians of our time and a warm person and friend. The emotion in his music has meant so much to me since meeting him so many years ago as an ensemble player and playing his music for him – his violin piece 'de terrae fine', the US premiere of 'in vain', and other works. I've since performed 'de terrae fine' many times. At the release concert for my album including 'de terrae fine', I was beyond thrilled when he told me he wanted to write a concerto for me."

Gene Gaudette, general manager of Urlicht AudioVisual, writes, "Georg Friedrich Haas is one of today's leading composers, and his music is seeing high profile performances in North America and



Europe this season. The *Concerto* is one of the finest such works I have heard from this century – a beautiful, passionate, powerful work with enormous narrative pull – and I am very excited the Urlicht AudioVisual will be issuing the world premiere recording of this work, captured live in concert."

Georg Friedrich Haas (b. 1953) studied composition with Ivan Eröd, Gösta Neuwirth, and Friedrich Cerha. He has taught composition at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz and the Music Academy in Basel, and in 2013 he was appointed MacDowell Professor of Music at New York's Columbia University, where he continues to teach. In a 2017 poll, Italian journal *Classic Voice* named Haas the most important living composer, with his work "in vain" topping the list of compositions. His music is frequently performed worldwide, and his recent work, *11,000 Saiten* for 50 microtonally tuned pianos and chamber orchestra, is a highlight of the 2025-26 Park Avenue Armory performance season.

Praised recently for "a rare style that fuse(s) precision and elegance with passionate intensity and successful risk-taking" [Berkshire Edge], violinist/violist **Miranda Cuckson**'s playing has, for many years, generated tremendous audience excitement and critical acclaim. In her wide variety of solo and collaborative performances, she continues to evolve and explore. Engaging with Western classical traditions and the many modern musical avenues she has ventured on, Miranda has pursued a personal path motivated by sincere interest and exploration, the expression of any human feelings and experiences, and the realization of virtuosity, craft, and invention. Her particular interests include the playing of stringed instruments in musical cultures and contexts, and the porousness of the arts of interpretation and composition.

In the past few years, Miranda has performed Haas' Violin Concerto No. 2 in four countries, and performed with John Adams at the Ojai Music Festival. Her live performance of the Ligeti Violin Concerto with the UC Davis Orchestra was released as a commercial recording to great acclaim.

In addition to performing around the USA and in her hometown of New York City, she has been a featured performer internationally at festivals including Wien Modern, Grafenegg, Sinus Ton, Le GuessWho, West Cork, Bard, Frequency, TimeSpans, Lincoln Center, and Ojai, and such presenters as St. Paul's Liquid Music, 92NY, Miller Theatre, Tokyo's Suntory Hall, Mexico City's Palacio de Bellas Artes, the Teatro Colón in Buenos Aires, the Library of Congress, and the Cleveland Museum.

She is a core member of the American Modern Opera Company (AMOC*), which is working at the forefront of interdisciplinary creation.

The present release is Miranda's sixth for Urlicht AudioVisual as principal artist; she has also recorded Ethan Iverson's Violin Sonata for Urlicht's best-selling *Playfair Sonatas*.

The concerto is conducted by **Markus Poschner**, who has emerged as a leading maestro of his generation, and is Chief Conductor of both the Bruckner Orchestra Linz and the Orchestra della Svizzera Italiana. His monumental, ambitious all-version edition of the Bruckner Symphonies with the Bruckner Orchestra Linz and ORF Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra – released on the Capriccio label as high-definition digital releases and also available as an 18 CD set from Naxos – was critically acclaimed as a singular highlight of the Bruckner bicentennial. This winter, Maestro Poschner will be appearing as a guest conductor with the Utah Symphony, and in the 2026~27 season Maestro Poschner will become the new Chief Conductor of the ORF Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra.

The **ORF Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra** defines itself in the Vienna orchestral tradition while breaking adventurous ground with its exceptional, bold programming. The orchestra has close ties

to the Salzburg Festival, musikprotokoll im steirischen herbst and Wien Modern, and gained a superb reputation both as an opera orchestra in collaboration with Theater an der Wien and performances of film music. Most of the orchestra's performances are broadcast on radio, particularly on Österreich 1, but also internationally; Vienna RSO performances are also available online for one week after initial broadcast. The Vienna RSO grew out of Austrian radio ORF's main orchestra in 1969. Under the leadership of its chief conductors – Milan Horvat, Leif Segerstam, Lothar Zagrosek, Pinchas Steinberg, Dennis Russell Davies, Bertrand de Billy, Cornelius Meister, and Marin Alsop – the orchestra has continuously expanded its repertoire, gaining growing international renown.
